The eight Gatsby Benchmarks provide a holistic career provision in schools and colleges and consist of:

Benchmark 1: A stable careers programme: Have an embedded programme of career education and guidance that is known and understood by students, parents, teachers, governors, employers and other agencies.

Benchmark 2: Learning from career and labour market information: Every student, and their parents (where appropriate), should have access to good quality information about future study options and labour market opportunities.

Benchmark 3: Addressing the needs of each pupil: Young people have different career guidance needs at different stages. Opportunities for advice and support need to be tailored to the needs of each pupil. The Careers Programme should embed equality and diversity considerations throughout.

Benchmark 4: Linking curriculum learning to careers: All subject staff should link curriculum with careers, even on courses that are not specifically occupation-led. Study programmes should also reflect the importance of maths and English as a key expectation from employers.

Benchmark 5: Encounters with employers and employees: Every student should have multiple opportunities to learn from employers about work, employment and the skills that are valued in the workplace.

Benchmark 6: Experiences of workplaces: Every student should have first-hand experiences of the workplace through work visits, work shadowing or work experience to help their exploration of career opportunities, and expand their networks.

Benchmark 7: Encounters with further and higher education: All students should understand the full range of learning opportunities that are available to them. This includes both technical and academic routes and learning in schools, colleges, universities and in the workplace

Benchmark 8: Personal guidance: Every student should have opportunities for guidance interviews with a career adviser, who could be internal (a member of school or college staff) or external, provided they are trained to an appropriate level.
